# understanding biblical (in)accuracy

# Marvin Zelkowitz University of Maryland

Although biblical scholars agree that the stories in the bible only approximate what happened in Israel some 2500 years ago, they cannot agree on exactly what did happen. The historical record (i.e., what was written in the bible and elsewhere) presents one view of kings David, Solomon and the 2 kingdoms of Judah and Israel, while the archaeological record (i.e., what is buried where) tells a very different story. In this talk, both correct but inconsistent views of the two kingdoms will be presented.

Adding confusion to this mix, whether due to profit motives of the unscrupulous or to promotion of ideology by religious zealots, is the impact of forgeries on this historical record. We will discuss two recent artifacts that have shaken the archaeological world - the James bone box that presents evidence that corroborates the existence of Jesus and the Jehoash tablet that corroborates the role of King Solomon in building the temple in Jerusalem. Both have now been declared forgeries, but for a time caused quite an uproar in this community.

Marvin Zelkowitz is a professor of Computer Science at the University of Maryland who has been interested in biblical history for over 30 years. This talk is a continuation of the talk he gave at NCAS in 1995 on "Who wrote the Bible's '5 Books of Moses?'"
